How to help at home

Reading

Please listen to your child read at home as often as you can, preferably daily, but at least three times each week. The love of reading is captured at a young age and it opens up the world to the reader. I understand that at this age children prefer to read alone, however, don't forget to ask questions and engage in conversations about what they are reading.

Maths

Please be sure your child knows their multiplication facts- These are so helpful in all forms of maths. Play maths games with your child and give them plenty of opportunities to solve word problems with an emphasis on explaining their reasoning.

Mathematics

Areas that will be covered this term will be:

- Four calculations
- Ordering numbers
- Number patterns and sequences
- Shape and space (including the properties of 2 & 3D shapes)
- Area and perimeter
- Data handling and measurements
- Time
- Fractions, decimals and percentages
- Average, mean, median, mode and range
- Mental maths strategies

<u>English</u>

Books we will be using are: Beowulf, (Michael Morpurgo and Poetry by Rudyard Kipling.

Writing

- Journalistic Writing
- Reports
- Non-chronological Writing
- Story structures characterisations, settings, openings, etc.
- Fiction Genres
- Poetry (the power of Imagery)

Daily Grammar, punctuation and comprehension.

Spelling Synonyms, antonyms, verb endings, prefixes & suffixes, plurals, root words, independent spelling strategies.

Homework

English and Maths homework this year will be undertaken in CGP KS2 maths and English Booster books. These text and practice books will be provided by the School. This is aimed at supporting Year 6 in their preparation for the SATs tests next May. Once the books have been sent home, with the appropriate instructions, they will be expected to be returned each Friday for marking and discussion. Offer your child help with their homework if needed but also give them the chance to be independent. Other homework may include craft topics or mini-projects that will be undertaken over a longer period. Spellings have been given out for the whole term, which are the key words needed by the end of Year 6 and the children will sit a test every Friday. IPC homework is given at relevant times, which will usually be a project to complete for the family!

International Primary Curriculum Autumn 1

This term Class 6 will be looking at the topic: The Great, the Bold, the Brave. During this topic we will be looking at the subjects below and learning about the following:

As **Historians** we will be:

- Finding out about the Greek city-states of Athens and Sparta
 - Exploring the political systems in Athens and Sparta
- Finding out about the Persian Wars and their impact on Greece
 - Learning about Athenian life by studying the Parthenon
 - Finding out about the origins of the Olympic Games
 - Finding out about Alexander the Great
 - Discovering why Rome had a republic and then an emperor
 - Finding out about daily life in Ancient Rome
 - Exploring the impact of Roman invasion on another country
- Understanding the cause and effect of the fall of the Roman Empire

As **Artists** we will be:

- Finding out about Ancient Greek and Roman art
- Creating our own piece of art in a Greek or Roman style

In International we will be:

• Finding out about the effects of invasion on countries around the world

All of the work we are going to do has been specially written to help your child reach the learning goals. Children will be reading, researching, writing, illustrating, working on their own and working in groups. We will be checking to see how well your child has learned through particular activities and asking children to explain their work, perhaps to you.
