I have just had it confirmed that for our school to join the Diocese's Multi Academy Trust on the 1st of May, Lambeth had to complete the necessary paperwork by last Friday. This they did not do in time. As such, we are now scheduled to convert on June 1st instead. So be it.

There's a lesser known poem called, "Self Help" by Charles Bernstein which offers the reader a chance to reflect on many of life's circumstances. Bernstein's poem is very pragmatic in places - and never more so than in the following line:

"Miss the train? - Great chance to explore the station!"

We've "missed the latest MAT train", so I'm left to "explore Lambeth Central station" whilst looking forward to the journey ahead. The first thing I note is that it's inadequately staffed.
