

In understanding the need for balance in the way we each live our lives, during the summer holidays, encourage your child to reflect on this at their own level of understanding. Whatever your child enjoys or is passionate about, I do hope that they take the opportunity to read something significant that they find engaging during the holiday. There is however, also the need to relax. England's curriculum is incredibly challenging; teaching and learning alike. Relaxation has an important role to play in being able to teach and learn effectively, something which the children are learning about as part of our whole school "Jigsaw" programme, which focuses on developing the children personally, socially and emotionally.

It is fine for children to wear winter or summer uniform. Please note that the Summer uniform is as follows:

Boys

Grey (not black) shorts or trousers
White long or short sleeved shirt (tucked in!!!)

Girls

Blue and white chequered summer dress

Please note, boys and girls are required to wear black shoes / sandals. No open toed shoes are to be worn. Girls are not allowed to mix and match winter and summer uniform - therefore socks but not tights must be worn with the summer dress.
